



## Can schools use data from High School and Beyond to create course requests?

Yes, there are two main ways schools can use High School and Beyond data to facilitate course offerings for the next term or school year.


We've created a data-table export that makes it simple to take the courses students have chosen for their Four Year Plans and import them into Skyward or Power School. (Other Student Information Systems can be accommodated upon request.)

Districts can also use tools in the Graduation Monitor to point up the need for specific coursework that students are at risk of missing. Venn diagrams help counselors discern how many students may need a given course or combination of courses to fulfill their credit, non-credit, and proficiency requirements. Educators can access a list of the students in each category directly from this screen, simply by clicking on a figure in the diagram.




Is it possible to create custom Four Year Plan templates?

**Yes!** Districts (and even individual schools) can create unique plan templates that serve their students' post-secondary plans. You may choose to pre-formulate plans for students who are pursuing military services or careers in the trades or hospitality, or ones who have their eyes on being admitted to selective universities or art schools.



Any personalized pathway can be supported with a Four Year Plan. When we create custom templates, we are able to customize them toward your students' needs. For example, we could include specific CTE sequences or remove World Language for students who do not plan to take language courses. Once the student has selected a graduation pathway, the educator can go into Four Year Plans to add the student's substitution or waiver.




Our general recommendation is to adapt a handful of plans used by other districts as your starting point, and then work with our team on any additional templates that require development.

**Yes,** if a district chooses, parents can be set up with their own logins to monitor students' progress through each portion of their High School and Beyond preparation.

The Assemble My Portfolio page, which is visible to both students and parents, shows the status of each task that a student can complete in the High School and Beyond application. From this one page, parents can click through to the results of their child's self-assessments, favorited careers and schools, goals, compositions, and printable resumes.



## Can districts monitor students' progress through High School and Beyond requirements?

**Yes,** there's a built-in report that details the progress of a student or group of students through each of their required tasks. The High School and Beyond Completion Report indicates whether the status of each task is complete or incomplete. It also records results such as assessed interests and skills, favorited careers, and any goals the student has entered. A copy of the student's Four Year Plan is attached to the report as well, along with any waivers or exceptions that correspond to their Personal Pathway Requirement. This tool is especially useful for sharing progress reports with students or parents.

High School and Beyond completion information is also available in a data table that can be sorted or filtered to target students who share an advisor or have the same requirements outstanding. The table shows the percentage complete for any assessments that have been begun, as well as the most recent upload date for contents like goals, letters, and resumes.
